At that point it made sense... Fooling around was his way of distracting himself from the pain. As the week continued, God continued to work on his heart. During testimony time on Friday, in front of everyone, he shared about meeting his new heavenly Father at camp this week.

# **2022 TERM TWO REPORT**

Term Two was an energized population of campers from Newark, Elizabeth, The Oranges, New Brunswick, Paterson, NJ; The Bronx, Brooklyn, Queens, NY; and Philadelphia, PA. The competition was not contained to basketball courts and soccer fields it even spilled over into cabin clean-up! The team cheers in the dining hall were absolutely deafening... But the most exciting part of the week was watching Christ's love at work in individual campers.





### **Now It Makes Sense**

A counselor shared what he learned about one of his 13-year-old campers who had been driving him crazy. "(The camper) told me, 'If she didn't leave us, she'd still be here." The boy told him that shortly after his mom left his dad she was shot and killed. He opened up about living with his father before he too passed away due to complications with COVID. The counselor said his camper's behavior now made perfect sense. For the rest of the week, the mission was clear- remain patient.

On Thursday night, a 14-year-old young man turned to his counselor as the speaker closed out the message and couldn't hold it in any longer. Tears filled his eyes as he told his counselor, "No one loves me." He spent the next 30 minutes crying on his 21-year-old athletic counselor's shoulder. This same camper had been in a couple of verbal and one minor physical altercation earlier in the week. Each time, his counselors and lead

counselor would sit with him and kindly talk through things with him. He was searching for love and was met by men who showed him the love of Christ all week long.



# **Unplanned but not Uncommon**

As the rest of the camp was at sports specialties and activities this lead counselor and a girl from her area shared an unscheduled moment on the ground outside the dining hall. Someone in her cabin group said something that set her off during breakfast, and she was taken outside to cool down. After a long talk with her counselor, the lead counselor took over. The interaction went from anger to this tear-filled embrace. I don't know the details of this conversation, but I do know that these acts of love and teachable moments happen all the time at ISC.

- "This week I learned how to love myself and that Jesus loves me just the way I am."
- "I learned how to build a relationship with Jesus and I also learned about the wages of sin."
- "I feel like I can pray in a more organized manner now."
- "Jesus made me a new man."



This camper shared, "After learning more about God and what Jesus did for me this week, I rang the bell and accepted Jesus... I am no longer in a bad mood and I am going home with so much love for my family and more importantly for God."

During Term Three we hosted young people from outreaches to housing projects all across NYC; a mentoring organization from Bushwick, Brooklyn; and other partners from Newark, Irvington, and Hackensack, NJ; and Harrisburg, PA. All week long we battled a real enemy named Satan, whose strong grip was visible in so many young lives. However, by the end of the week, we witnessed real victory as MANY campers surrendered their lives to our savior Jesus Christ!







# **HIS Perfect Pairings**

Each week co-counselors are assigned to age group-specific cabins, but it is God that puts the right people together. As they shoot hoops, catch fish, and have water gun fights, trust builds and friendships form between our counselors and campers. Here is a sampling of the connections and conversations that we couldn't possibly plan:

- A counselor noticed that one boy would shut down and withdraw in the large group settings. When the counselor asked him about this, the camper talked about spending a lot of time alone ever since his parents divorced. As they talked more, the counselor learned that this camper loved to read just like he did. That night, the counselor shared about one of his favorite books and took it upon himself to order it for the camper on Amazon. The counselor thought the book would encourage this camper, and it will arrive as soon as he gets home!
- In another cabin, during small groups, a teenage camper from NY opened up to his
  counselors about watching his brother die right in front of him. It was a quiet and
  serious moment. The counselors empathetically listened and one of them
  responded that he knows what it feels like to lose someone special because not
  long ago he watched his best friend die in front of him back home in Newark.

Our young adult summer staff team has made themselves available and God continues to place them perfectly for interactions just like these.



### **Current Reality**

During our mid-week leadership meeting, we received feedback about six campers who had already opened up about sexual identity issues. Thankfully God makes no mistakes, even in scheduling that happens months in advance. Patti Height was here on Thursday all the way from California to share her personal story about how Jesus rescued her from gender confusion and a homosexual lifestyle. After each session, she had a Q & A. In all our years, we've never heard more poignant camper questions. After the last session, she stayed for hours talking to and praying with campers who needed to talk more. Young people today are being fed more lies than ever before, but we need to remember that this spiritual battle is not lost... Christ's love and truth win!



### The mission field truly came to us this week!!

This young boy moved from China to NYC just 3 months ago and still can't speak English. He was able to enjoy all of the activities, but this made communication throughout the week very challenging. On Thursday morning, when every other camper received NLT Bibles, we gave him a Bible in Mandarin and he began devouring it right away!

- "I felt God talking to me yesterday when I was praying to Him."
- "Before I came here, I didn't believe in God and I thought it was all fake. But here I learned all about what Jesus did for me."
- "I learned that if I give all my worries to Him, he will change my life."
- "This week I got to hang out with actual people, and actually went outside."
- "I never went to church before, just went to Sunday school one time. I think I will start to read the Bible and keep attending the Sunday school in NYC."
- I learned that even when I don't feel or see it, God is always working and He had a plan for me."
- "My life changed this week because I gained more friends and learned how the Bible works."
- "I needed a break from my phone."
- "I never had this much fun."

ISC Family,



### No Bags But Lots of Baggage

On Sunday, as campers filed through check-in lines, we realized that many of them were not carrying much. Some had no duffle bag or suitcase, and no bedding at all. It was apparent that the few clothes and toiletries they did have with them had been thrown in the shopping bag they were carrying right before the bus picked them up. Campers showing up without many possessions is not uncommon at ISC, but this week it was more than normal. Our team, as always, made sure each child received everything they needed, and they all went home with brand new clothes and footwear.

Although many came without formal baggage, this population was full of personal baggage. However, these campers were eager to unload it. It was almost like they were waiting for someone to listen. Counselors heard about poor living conditions, sharing beds at home, families living in shelters, neighborhood violence, domestic unrest, drugaddicted mothers, incarcerated fathers, sexual identity issues, and more. As counselors listened and the love of Christ flowed from them, they earned the right to share with their campers. Counselors not only shared their own stories but the ultimate story - that Christ has a plan for our lives both now and for eternity - and the response was humbling!



# A Supernatural Response

The ISC "Born Again" bell rang consistently since Wednesday morning, but God wasn't done yet. The picture above was taken Thursday night at CLUB. Our speaker, Pastor Charles Taylor, challenged campers multiple times throughout the message. He asked them, "How will YOU go?" He further explained that "It's not about whether Jesus will walk with you because He always will. The question is will YOU walk with Him?" When he gave the young crowd an opportunity to respond, they came forward in droves. Counselors followed and huddled with their campers praying with them and praying over them at the front of the stage.
